**Sacrament of Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

**Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:** The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

**Sacraments to the Home Bound:** Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

### **Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,**

Today, we celebrate the solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord, and it marks the official end of Christmas season. Till yesterday, we celebrated and reflected about the life of the 'infant Jesus', but starting today, we celebrate and reflect about the life of 'adult Jesus'. Yes, the Baptism is a sacrament where one is purified of his/her original sins, but today as we celebrate this great solemnity, there could be questions regarding Jesus' Baptism such as why at all Jesus should receive the sacrament of Baptism from St. John the Baptist for Jesus is born without any sin.

The attitude behind receiving the sacrament of Baptism by Jesus is explained in St. Paul's letter to the Philippians 2:6-8, "*Though he was in the form of God, he did not count equality with God something to be grasped at. Rather, he emptied himself and took the form of a slave, being born in the likeness of men. He was known to be of human state, and it was thus that he humbled himself, obediently accepting even death, death on a cross*". Yes, Jesus wanted to identify Himself with each one of us and show His solidarity with the entire humanity. Thus, we see the great humility of Jesus or our God Himself. It is a self-surrendering of Jesus to His Father's will of Passion, Death and Resurrection. So Jesus very clearly indicates to us that Baptism is not the sacrament of showing our pride, but it is a sacrament which calls us for humility and obedience to His Father's will.

In the Gospel, we see the great humility of Jesus is being paid off very well. The Gospel states that while He was praying, three magnificent things happened in Jesus life: Heaven was opened, the Holy Spirit came down on Him, and finally, He was able to hear the voice of God, "*You are my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased*". Yes, here we see the Trinitarian God is in action Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As Christians, every one of us is called to experience this Trinitarian God in our lives, and the way to experience this is nothing but to be humble. This is what Jesus says to us always, "*Learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart*".

During this Mass, let us ask the Lord to make us more humble so that we may hear the same voice from the Father, "*You are my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased*". Thus being pleased with the Father, we may be pleased with everyone in our lives and find peace on earth.
