Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Luke 18:9-14

“O God, be merciful to me, a sinner”

Jesus tells of a Pharisee and a tax collector in the temple to pray. Actually, the Pharisee went to the temple to brag: “O God, I thank you I am not like the rest of humanity . . .” The Pharisee is probably a good man. But he seems to be thanking God that he has no need of God; that he is self-made and self-sufficient. The tax collector does not even raise his eyes to heaven. He is aware that he is a sinner and prays for mercy. He acknowledges his dependence on God for all that he has, all that he is and all the he ever will be. He stands present to God with all of his flaws and ask God’s forgiveness for the ways he failed to be all that God created him to be. Both are stewards of all that God gave them. But it is the tax collector, not the Pharisee, who understands that. It is the tax collector who asked for forgiveness. Good stewards know and admit when they have failed to be a good steward, and ask God for forgiveness. When we stand before God, are we like the Pharisee or are we like the tax collector?

**Sacrament of Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

**Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:** The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

**Sacraments to the Home Bound:** Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.
