Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

"What should we do?" is the important question we often ask ourselves and others when we confront problems and difficulties in our day-to-day lives. This is a very determined question we make in our lives, ready to take any risk to solve the problem we are facing as we get closer to the greatest celebration of the world, Christmas. On this 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent, each one of us are challenged with the same important question, "What should we do?" Yes, this question comes before us in the middle of our preparation period of the feast of Christmas. By taking up this question seriously in our lives, it forces us to ask another question to ourselves; what are the preparations we have already made for the smooth traveling of Joseph and Mary to give birth to Jesus in our hearts?

St. John the Baptist, the spokes-person of Jesus' public ministry, went around and preached the Good News of repentance to prepare the way for the Lord. We see there were all kinds of people gathered around to listen to his preaching. People, those who found problem with their own lives after listening to the repentance preaching of St. John the Baptist, asked the same question, "What should we do?" I think the answer to this question by St. John the Baptist is relevant even today. John told them, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none, and whoever has food should do likewise." Dear friends, by saying this, Jesus does not mean that everyone should share our entire wealth and things with others, but He is concerned about fulfilling the basic needs of every one. So in our knowledge, there should not be a person lacking any basic need of human life in the world. Yes, it is big challenge for all of us to accept the challenge of what should we do. Yes, the tax collectors, soldiers and people, those who are in authority, came to St. John the Baptist and asked the same question, "What should we do?" Yes, John did not ask them to abandon their job, but rather he asks them to be more responsible and sincere in their respective duties and to other citizens. Thus, St. John the Baptist gives us the message that every job has its dignity and so tells us that sincere work is a worship of God.

Thus, the Gospel of today invites us to celebrate Christmas not only as Merry Christmas, but more as Holy Christmas. Yes, Christmas can be made Holy only when the Holy One is with us. As we are preparing to receive the Holy One, we cannot ignore the unavoidable arrangements St. John the Baptist has told us to do through today's Gospel. By doing so, let us get prepared to get baptized with the Holy Spirit and Fire and become a new person in Child Jesus. Let us stop asking the question, "What should we do?" The answers are right before us, so let us work on it and make this Christmas a beautiful one. God Bless You All.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** *The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.*

**Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:** *The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.*

**Sacraments to the Home Bound:** *Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.*

**Sacrament of Marriage:** *A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.*
