Sacrament of Baptism: *The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.*

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: *The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.*

Sacraments to the Home Bound: *Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.*

Sacrament of Marriage: *A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.*



Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

A U.S Congressman died and went to heaven. St. Peter greeted him at the door of heaven with a wide smile and said, “normally we don’t see any congressman here”. Then St. Peter explained, this is how things work here. You will spend one day in hell and one day in heaven, after that you will have to choose where you want to spend your eternity. When the congressman went to hell, he saw the golf course, clubhouse and all his politician friends eating and drinking and dancing. Their host, the devil appeared to be very attractive and very pleasant. The next day, when the congressman went to heaven, he saw many happy souls playing musical instruments and singing. After the day in heaven, St Peter came to the congressman, said it is time for you to choose your eternity. After much reflection, the congressman selected hell. When he went back to hell, he realized that the entire situation had changed. He saw a barren land full of garbage, fire and smoke, and his friends wearing dirty clothes and suffering. A smiling devil greeted him. The congressman protested and said, yesterday there was golf, lobster, champagne, great drinks, great food, dancing etc., what happened? The smiling devil replied, yesterday we were campaigning and today you voted.

Dear friends, in today’s Gospel, we see the end of St. John the Baptist’s campaign for the Kingdom of God with his arrest by King Herod, and the beginning of Jesus’ campaign for the Kingdom of God, immediately after John’s arrest. We learn from the Gospels that St. John the Baptist and Jesus had the same campaign slogan, which is “**Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand.**” Today, as you listen to my campaign preaching for the Kingdom of God on behalf of Jesus, Jesus expects our great support by accepting this great slogan of “Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand” into our own hearts and to live accordingly. Yes, darkness is the result of sin, but light is the result of repentance and good life, and Jesus is the light of our life and world. This is the reason Matthew welcomes the beginning of Jesus’ campaign by quoting the prophet Isaiah “*the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light,*”

Yes, every one of us is called to be a light in this darkened world, that is why Jesus says in Matthew 5:14 “*You are the light of the world.*” Yes, you and I are chosen to be the light of the world through the sacrament of Baptism through which we become a new creation in Christ. This is the same transformation Jesus is expecting from each one of us when He calls us for repentance. Yes, it is a personal call to each one of us to live in holiness, just like Jesus calls Peter, Andrew, James and John in today’s Gospel. This call is not so much based on holiness but of willingness to follow Him for one who is calling us is Holy. Are you ready to accept the call of holiness and become His true disciple? Please do not look at your worthiness. That is the business of God, but are you willing to follow Him just like the disciples to spread the light of Christ to this world?

This Sunday is celebrated as the Vocation Sunday in our diocese. Vocation to priesthood and religious life. As parents, you have an important role to play in promoting and encouraging your children to choose this special call to priesthood and religious life. Now, in your own family, how many of you initiate talking about encouraging your children to become a priest or nun? Young children, Jesus is calling you, “*Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.*” It is not a call to enjoy your life, but it is a call to embrace the cross of Jesus in your life and help others to carry the cross of Jesus in their lives. Yes, it is a call to campaign for Jesus and His Kingdom, “Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand.” **God Bless you all ...**
