

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

As Christians, no one wants to be tempted or be tested by the devil or by anything that goes against the will of God, but it is a common reality that everyone goes through different types of temptations and testing periods in their daily lives. In today's Gospel, we see that, just like anyone of us, Jesus is being thrown into temptation soon after His baptism. So as we began starting our Lenten Journey, the Gospel reminds us that as Christians we cannot run away from temptations, but rather we have to face it in our lives. The life of Jesus gives us the positive message that the testing time is not a wasting time, but rather it is the best time of preparation to take up a greater mission. Yes, it was a training period for Jesus to begin His public ministry.

The Gospel states that Jesus was in the desert for forty days by Himself fighting against Satan among wild beasts. Yes, forty days of war between good and evil. Look at our situation and the situation of the world today, we are almost in the same situation of Jesus. There is always a constant war going on between good and evil within us and within this world in the form of war, killings, kidnaping, sicknesses, injustice, corruption etc. There are wild beats around us too, to attack us, to kill us, to scare us and to destroy us in different ways. Yes, some are affected directly and some indirectly by all these evils, but the Gospel clearly reminds us the sufferings ones are not alone, they are always ministered by angels.

As Christians, we know that through the sacrament of Baptism, we have joined the military group of Jesus and so we are called Christians. But do we fight sincerely against the evil of this world from the side of Jesus? Yes, we are all given the weapons like the Bible, the rosary, the sacraments and sacramentals to fight against the evils of this world, but do we use them properly? If we deeply reflect, we can find that by wearing the uniform of Jesus' military and holding the weapons He has given us, we often spy against the kingdom God through our sins. Yes through our sins we are betraying our own kingdom.

Yes, our lack of faithfulness is known to the commander in Chief of our army, Jesus. He is not taking any strong action against us, but He is giving us another chance to us by saying “Repent”. Yes, Jesus is calling us to become faithful soldiers for the Kingdom of God and fight against the evils of this world. Jesus is calling us for repentance with the good news that we are approaching to the final victory of our war by saying, “Repent and believe in the Gospel for the kingdom of God is at hand”. Yes, Jesus wants every one of us to join the victory celebrations of the kingdom of God. Think and think, will you be there when Jesus comes in glory? The call comes to us again- Repent and believe in the Gospel for the kingdom of God is at hand”. May you have the grace to hear this call of Jesus, through fasting, prayer and alms giving. **Sacrament of Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

**Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:** The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

**Sacraments to the Home Bound:** Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.
