Sacrament of Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

Sacraments to the Home Bound: Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

Sacrament of Marriage: A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Very often, we are reminded that the call of a Christian is not to be indifferent, but to be different. The call of a Christian is not to be a mere human being, but be a super human being. Yes, the call to be a Christian is not an ordinary call, but it is an extraordinary call. Highlighting the importance of the call we have received, Jesus reminds us of the very purpose of our Christian call by saying, "*be perfect just as your heavenly father is perfect.*" Yes, every Christian journey is supposed to be a pilgrimage (Journey with God) aimed at reaching the perfection (Kingdom of God). To fulfill our journey to its completion, Jesus came to this world in the form of a man.

We know, that as soon as spring season starts, some of the county and state roads are under maintenance and new roads are being made for our easy journey. Suppose we are depending on GPS for our journey to a distant place, and if the GPS is not updated every year, there is a possibility that we could get lost on our way. The same way, the arrival of Jesus into our midst can be considered as the updated GPS for us to enter into the Kingdom of God. This is the reason Jesus says, "*I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes the Father, except though me.*"

Very often, we have discussed the defect of the teaching of Scribes and Pharisees. Yes, their teachings of the law or the commandments were not helpful for the people to experience God in their lives, and very often it was misleading. It is in this situation, God the Father felt the need of a good teacher with updated syllabus to teach the people, so we have Jesus in our midst. So as Jesus begins His ministry, He makes it very clear that, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets, I have not come to abolish them, but to fulfill them" (Mt. 5:17). The Gospel of today is the updated teachings of Jesus.

Before we read through the Gospel of today again, I just want to remind you that we are not the children of the Old Testament, but we are the children of the New Testament. We are not the slave of the Jewish Law, but we are the children of the Covenantal Love of Jesus' precious Blood. Still I feel some of us continue to be part of the Old Testament and a slave of Jewish Law. Let us examine ourselves. Do we still keep anger and revenge against the other? Do we still hate our enemy? Do we still keep ill feelings towards the other? Do we still think, speak and act against Love of God and Neighbor? If we do all these, Jesus asks the question to, what is the difference we make as Christians in this world? If we continue to act against Love of God and Neighbor, wow can we say that we have Faith in Jesus? How can we call ourselves a Christian? Jesus says, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

Yes, dear friends, we are all grown up. We all need to update our attitude according to the updated teachings of Jesus for Jesus very clearly says to us again that "Unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter into the Kingdom of Heaven." May the love of God and neighbor reign in our hearts always. **God Bless.**
