Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Last weekend, the enlightenment given by Jesus was that the Kingdom of God is a mystery and experience of this mystery happens in our lives in a mysterious way just like that of a seed growing in the farm. Today, Jesus invites us to take this experience of mystery to other countries and people. As we are making our journey to the other side, the Gospel of today presents to us four questions through the character of Jesus and His disciples. These four questions are part of our lives during our journey to the other side of the world. These four questions are:

1. Teacher do you not care that we are perishing? Asked by disciples and us.
2. Why are you terrified?
3. Do you not yet have faith? Asked by Jesus to disciples and us.
4. Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey? Asked by disciples and us.

Faced with problems, difficulties, tensions, worries, death and sickness most of us raise the same type question to God, "God, do you not care that we are perishing? Why do you allow sufferings in our lives? Why has death taken the lives of our dear ones? Why this sickness etc.? Some people get answers from God, and they get back to normal, but some do not get their answer and continue to live their lives in tension and worries. The Gospel of today says to us that the disciples asked the same question to Jesus. Jesus was asleep on a cushion, and they woke Him and asked the question. Yes, this is the first step to be followed before we raise the question to God. Wake up the spirit of the Lord that is sleeping in us, and we will have the right answer for our different questions to God. To wake up the Good Spirit in us, we have the sacraments, prayers and charitable works to be done.

Why are you terrified? Do you not have faith is the response of Jesus to us? Fear is sponsored by the devil, and Faith sponsored by God. Think which sponsor has influenced you and is influencing you? Through the Bible God says 365 times, "Do not be afraid". The number 365 times shows God's daily care and concern for each one of us, yet still we are worried, scared of things and happenings. Jesus is asking each one of us, do you not have faith? Give an answer to Jesus.

Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey? This question is raised from their excitement. Yes, up to now, we have come across so many big and small obstacles in our lives. Did we ever try to find out the mysterious power behind all those moments? It is the same question Jesus had to face Himself on different occasions. Yes, dear friends, our life should be a search for finding this mysterious power to which everything in this world obeys. Yes, to find out we need to walk through His ways, read through His words and go through His entire life and be sure that would give us enough Faith to not worry any more because HE IS JESUS CHRIST. CHRIST YESTERDAY, TODAY AND FOREVER.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

Sacraments to the Home Bound: Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

Sacrament of Marriage: A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.
