Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Some foreigners in a certain land went against the laws of the land and were put into prison before they could be executed. They requested to see the King to plead for pardon. On hearing their request, the king decided to visit them in Prison. In his simplicity, he put on an ordinary man's dress and went to see them, but unfortunately the foreigners did not recognize him because they had not known him previously. They ignored him when he introduced himself as the king because they expected to see the man in royal outfit. Unfortunately, the king left them without any favor because they did not value him. Often times, we experience this kind of situation when we meet important people. Today, we are celebrating the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. By inviting us to celebrate this great day, the Holy Mother church invites each one of us to value and experience the powerful Jesus in the ordinary Bread and Wine offered on the altar.

If you will remember two weekends ago, we celebrated two important solemnities of our Faith. We concluded the Easter season by celebrating the solemnity of Pentecost where every one was invited to open their hearts to receive the Holy Spirit. Last weekend, the celebration of Holy Trinity reminded us about our duties and obligations when we received the Spirit of the Lord in our hearts on Pentecost, and the Gospel on the day of Holy Trinity ended with the promise from the Lord that, "I will be with you always, until the end of the age." Today through this celebration of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, the promise that was given on last weekend is being fulfilled. Yes, the lasting presence of Christ is being made possible and visible through the Body and Blood of Jesus and that is the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. Today, our challenge is to value the presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. Yes, the King of the Universe is coming to see us, to hear us, and to save us in a different look in a very ordinary way in the form of Bread and Wine which is transformed into Body and Blood of Jesus. If we can identify Him, be sure, we are saved.

Yes, this is the covenant God made with each one of us. An everlasting promise to stay with us forever. Today, as we are celebrating this great feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, Jesus makes it very clear that He wants to be with you through this sacrament of Holy Eucharist, but do you want to be with Me? If you miss a chance to be a part of Holy Eucharist, remember that you miss a chance to be with Jesus. So reflect, you want to be or not to be? Freedom is given to you. Let us live our life responsibly.

May the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, give us eternal life. Amen.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

**Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:** The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

**Sacraments to the Home Bound:** Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.
