Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Last weekend's Gospel ended with Jesus calling people to follow Him, and we noticed that two people who were called by Jesus expressed their willingness to follow Him with certain conditions of fulfilling certain obligations in their lives. But Jesus reminded them that following Him is not a part time job, but it is a full time job. Following him is not a secondary thing in life but it is the primary thing in life.

When we go through the Bible, while the synoptic Gospels (Mathew, Mark & Luke) speak about the mission of the 12 apostles, only Luke mentions a second mission of 72. The Jews always believed that there were 72 nations in the whole world, thus, by sending 72 elders in pairs means Jesus sends out his missionaries to the entire world. When we talk about the mission of the 12, it is always misunderstood that it represents only the mission of the Pope, Cardinals, Bishops and priests who are the descendants of 12 apostles in today's world. But today, by sending 72 elders to the mission by Jesus, we are encouraged to believe that the mission is interested not only to the apostles, but also to each one of us who profess their faith in Jesus. So it is a call for you and me to go and preach the good news of peace to the world.

Yes, the world is crying for the good news of peace, but today, that peace is in different pieces as is the world and the people. Yes, every one of us are commissioned today to preach the good news of peace and unity and what do we do to materialize the mission of Jesus? Yes, that is what we pray in the prayer for Peace of St. Francis of Assisi.

"Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace.
Where there is hatred, let me sow love;
Where there is injury, pardon;
Where there is doubt, faith;
Where there is despair, hope;
Where there is darkness, light;
Where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek
To be consoled as to console,
To be understood as to understand,
To be loved as to love;
For it is in giving that we receive;
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;
It is in dying that we are born to eternal life."

Yes, my dear friends, it is easy to pray this prayer, but it is not that easy to live this prayer in our daily lives and that is why we see peace in pieces.

As Christians, Jesus reminds us that it is our primary responsibility to establish peace. Yes, we need to work towards achieving this peace in this world, Jesus promises no safety in this world, but He assures our safety in the Kingdom of God. Are you ready for it? **God Bless!**

Sacrament of Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

Sacraments to the Home Bound: Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

Sacrament of Marriage: A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.
