My Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Greetings of love and prayerful wishes to you from Fr. Jegin Puthenpurackal. Hope and pray that these few lines of mine will find you in the best health of mind and body. As the days are going by various incidents and problems call us to urgently come together and call upon God for the immediate intervention of Jesus in the world for real order because only our creator can organize this world in Peace and Love.

Today, if we look around the world in every democratic country. there are two or more political parities active. As elections are at the door step, we know that all the political parties come to the people with their own manifesto that they are planning to do if they get the power. People who support each party welcome their party's manifesto and live for and try to implement it. In today's gospel, we find Jesus is getting ready for an election campaign publishing His manifesto for the Kingdom of God. How many of us are really able to support Jesus and help him to become the ruler of your life, your family. your country and the world? The Manifesto of Jesus reads like this "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year of acceptable to the Lord." As followers of Jesus Christ, it is our manifesto too, as long as we live in this world, to remember that through Baptism each one of us has taken the membership in the Kingdom of God. As members, we should follow this without any fail. Now do you live your life according to the manifesto of Jesus? I am sure if we are to show 50% of the faithfulness and sincerity to the manifesto of Jesus that we show our political parities in this world. Our world should not have gone bad as we know it. But still we have the chance to get back the world for Jesus. Yes, we need to try to live at least from now on..... are you ready for a change?

Dear friends, by the very fact we have received the Spirit of the Lord through Baptism, it demands from us certain duties to be fulfilled here in this world. The first duty is to bring glad tidings to the poor. It means we should become effective messengers of good news, that we will be happy and those who hear us will also be happy forever. Now do you have the good news with you? The good news is nothing but the news of our God and His great and wonderful works in our life. Today, the greatest problem with Christians is that we know about Christ, but we do not know Christ. Just like I know who Obama, but Obama does not know me. So as to say God knows me, but I do not know God. Here the relationship is not sincere, it is only a one way relationship and as a result this relationship breaks up half of the way. Often that is what our life is all about also. Yes, we need to know Christ through and through in our personal life and that is the biggest good news we can give to the world. All the saints in our church are great examples for that.

The second duty is to give sight to the blind. When I know Christ personally the Lord becomes a lamp to my feet and a light to my path (Ps.119:105). It is only then we can recover sight for the blind, guiding everyone to the light of Christ. Remember in a state of sin everyone is in darkness and blindness.

The third duty is to free the oppressed and captives. To become a mediator for this duty, we need to look into our own self and see whether we are a free person in Jesus Christ or a captive? Gospel of John 8:34-36 says "Jesus answered them: I give you my assurance, everyone who lives in sin is the slave of sin and if the Son frees you, you will be really free." My dear friends, through the reception of the sacrament of Baptism, we received the spirit of the Lord, and we were all liberated ones in Jesus Christ, but now what is our status as we are in the presence of Jesus? Actually who is guiding and molding your life? If my thoughts, words and actions are not in accordance with the will of God there is no doubt we are in the state of slavery. If you are not a freed person in Jesus Christ, how can you free the oppressed and captives in this world? So we need to be liberated in Jesus Christ, and for that, we need to come to Jesus and know Jesus more personally and intimately. That is possible only when you and me are in the state of grace. Yes my dear friends, we all need a washing of our soul from the stain of sin through the power of the blood of Christ, and it is there begins a new life acceptable to the Lord.

During this Eucharistic Celebration, as Jesus is shedding His precious blood on this alter, let us ask Him earnestly to pour His precious blood on each one of us so that we all will be cleansed; that our family will be cleansed, and thus the whole world will be sanctified through His precious blood. For in the book of *Joshua* 3: 5 says to the people "Sanctify yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will perform wonders among you." May the Good Lord Bless you with sanctity and enable you to see the wonders too.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacraments to the Home Bound

Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.




Faith in God Made Visible in Loving Action
