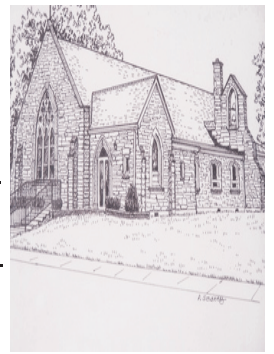

Sacraments to the Home Bound: Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

Sacrament of Marriage: A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

My Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Since from our birth, we have come in contact with so many people in our lives. Among them, some have influenced us positively, some negatively, and still some without making any impact on our lives. Whatever it may be, though many years have passed, some people and the time we spent with them still brings more joy and happiness to each one of us. We love to cherish those moments again and again, and they live in our hearts every time and every day.

As we deal with today's gospel, it is strange to see that group of Sadducees, who never believed in the resurrection, are eager to discuss the topic of "Resurrection" with Jesus by presenting the story of a childless woman who married seven brothers and died. They wish to know from Jesus that at the time of Resurrection whose wife this woman would be?

The Sadducees, who never believed in immortality nor in angels or evil spirits, instead believed in an earthly image of heaven. They enjoyed their life here on earth to the maximum according to their personal will. Today if we look around, we find so many people have the attitude of Sadducees giving more importance to their personal inclinations and will than to the will of God.

Reflecting on the main topic of 'Resurrection' through today's gospel, Jesus gives us three beautiful messages. Firstly, Jesus says marriage is the need of the present age and entering into this status of life, the participants should encourage and support each other to attain personal holiness which helps them to witness the coming age and to the resurrection of dead.

Secondly, Jesus gives us an insight about what happens to us through our death after a meaningful life here on earth. Jesus states that if we live worthily, we will be like an angel and children of God. The book of Hebrews 2:7 and Psalm 8:5 in reference to human dignity state that "we are created little less than the angels". Today as we live in this world as little less than the angels, Jesus promises that we will become like angels after our death, and we will taste resurrection provided we live according to the will of God.

Thirdly, Jesus says that the God in whom we are called to believe, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, is not the God of the dead, but of the living. Yes, the same God still continues to inspire us and inspires many through the sacraments and many other ways. Today, we have so many people who received and lived the inspiration from the same God, and they are the saints. Today, we are here in this church because we are inspired by the living God. Dear friends, let us ask the living Eucharistic Lord to inspire us always to seek His will in every moment of our lives. Yes, Jesus Christ is the same Yesterday, Today and Forever.

May the Living God continue to inspire you to live in this world as His True Children to become an Angel and taste His glorious Resurrection after death. Amen.
