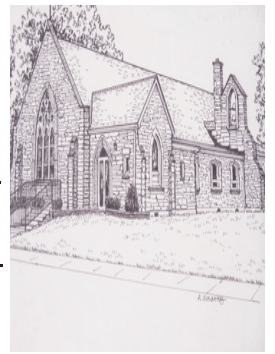

**Sacraments to the Home Bound:** Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

**Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:** The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

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"The son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost"

My Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Have you ever been to a parade where you couldn't see over the person in front of you? I am sure, it is not much fun to go to a parade if you can't see the marching bands, the floats, or the fire trucks with their flashing lights. Today we have a beautiful Bible story which speaks about a little man who went to a parade, but couldn't see above the crowd. The main attraction in this parade was Jesus. Jesus had become quite famous because He had performed many miracles. He had raised Lazarus from the dead and had restored sight to a blind man named Bartimaeus. So when He entered the city of Jericho, the atmosphere was very much like a circus parade. People lined the streets hoping to get a glimpse of Jesus, but our little man was not able to see Jesus.

In today's gospel passage, we are reflecting on two people. The first person is Zacchaeus, one of the most hated men in all of Jericho. The second person is Jesus the main attraction of the story. People hated Zacchaeus because Zacchaeus was a little man with a great big problem! He was a thief and a cheat! He was the chief tax collector, and he had become very rich by cheating and collecting more taxes from people. Considering the problem of Zacchaeus, let us ask some questions to ourselves. Do I hate someone in my life? Am I hated by anybody? If the answer is YES, be sure we are wearing the mask of Zacchaeus and the crowd. They both lack sincerity and faithfulness to God.

The main attraction of the story is Jesus, because Jesus did good things for the people. Here we see Jesus stands as a true individual and makes Himself different from the crowd and their mentality. When all the people hated Zacchaeus, there was only one person who really loved Zacchaeus, that is Jesus. If we look around, we can find so many Zacchaeus, but very seldom do we find Jesus around. Today, as we reflect on this passage Jesus on the Altar looking for someone who can share His true love with all the Zacchaeus around. At the same time be sure, all the Zacchaeus are waiting for a true Jesus too. Today Jesus comes to us personally and knocks at the door of our heart and asks can you go for me?

Something to be remembered from this passage is that though there were so many people gathered to see Jesus, there was only one person, Zacchaeus, who really thirsted for Jesus, to experience Him, and that is why knowing the heart of Zacchaeus Jesus says, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly for today I must stay at your house". Yes, it is applicable for each one of us today. We have many people gathered here for the Holy Eucharistic celebration, but how many of us are really thirsting for the experience of Jesus?

Dear friends, before we leave this Eucharistic Table, we need to answer a number of questions:

Do I wear the mask of old Zacchaeus?

Can I be different for Jesus in this crowded world?

Yes, the love of Jesus changes everything and can I be Jesus' love in this world?

Why have I come to church today- to see Jesus like the crowd or to experience Jesus like Zacchaeus?

Dear friends, the distances from old Zacchaeus to new Zacchaeus in Christ is not far away, but a few words away- saying a sincere sorry. During this Mass let us ask for the grace to say a sincere sorry for our sins and to experience

Jesus. Amen.
