

Sacraments to the Home Bound

Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Person to person, the reason for distraction is different. Anything that we do without concentration will end up in a bad result and dissatisfaction. So concentration in life is very much essential to be successful.

Through today's gospel, Jesus invites each one of us to make a transition from the stage of 'good' to be a 'better' person by listening to Him. In the gospel, we see Martha and Mary are making every effort to be hospitable to Jesus. But Martha thinks that her sister, Mary, is not doing her part and the attitude of Mary disturbs the mind of Martha, and she makes the remark to Jesus. But Jesus points out to Martha that she is disturbed by many things. This is a common situation we find in most of our families and communities, finding fault with others for not helping.

Our first thought may be that Mary is lazy and Martha is dutiful. Something to be considered here is that though Martha is pretending to be hospitable, she is not fully hospitable or committed to Jesus that is why she complains to Jesus about her own sister/ Whereas Mary keenly listens to Jesus and reflects on every word He is saying to her, she expresses her commitment and full respect to Jesus. Often as human beings, we think like Martha, that preparing material comfort is the utmost expression of our hospitality, but Jesus points out that it is not the material comfort that is important but rather the understanding of the others and the listening to the others is important.

In and around, we have so many examples where people have all kinds of material comfort but very seldom do they enjoy peace of mind and understand each other and talk to each other. Today, by appreciating Mary for her act, Jesus invites each one of us to grow to the level of Mary and listen to Him and to each other for listening is an art and listening without distraction is a difficult job to do. Listening to the other person without distraction shows how much care we are taking for that person and how much respect that we are giving to that person.

Now let us ask some personal question to ourselves. Do I have an undisturbed heart when others speak to me? Do I listen to my wife, husband, children, friends, relatives with an undisturbed mind? Do I listen to Jesus in my life? Even in my relationship with Jesus in prayer, do I make an effort to listen to Him, as I make the effort to speak to Him?

At some point in your life, you may complain that no one understands your problem, no one is talking to you, and no one is listening to your problems. Remember always that there is one person who is always willing to talk to you and listens to you. Do not ever forget to dial His number in your life. Try to make a call to Him at least once a day and talk to Him for sometime for He has an answer to all your questions and a solution for all your problems and His name is Jesus.
