We are glad that you are here to share the Liturgy with our community. Those who plan to move from our parish are requested to inform the office.

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

In the last three weekends, Jesus has been launching a series of attacks against the Orthodox Jewish Leaders-Scribes, Pharisees and elders of the people through the parables of two sons who were asked to go for work in the vineyard (Mt.21:28-32), the parable of the wicked tenants (Mt.21:33-46), and through the parable of the wedding feast, in the last weekend. Since then the scribes, Pharisees and elders of the people were plotting against Jesus, to attack Him. Thus today, they try to trap Jesus by asking a carefully formulated question- "*Is it lawful to pay census tax to Caesar or not?*"

Interestingly, in Jesus' time Pharisees and Herodians were greatest enemies. Because in the heart of heart Pharisees never supported the system of paying taxes to the King and, on the other hand Herodians were the ones who collected taxes. But today, we see the great enemies come together to fight against their common enemy-Jesus, by raising a tricky question to Jesus- "*Is it lawful to pay census tax to Caesar or not?*" Understanding the malice intention Jesus gave them a beautiful answer "*repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.*" Dear friends, this answer of Jesus' is a direct answer to our life itself.

Yes, the question raised by the scribes, Pharisees and elders of the people is intended to bring a conflict between the law of the state and the law of God. We know that, Jesus never taught any civil law, but He taught us what is love and how to love our God and our neighbor. As a disciple of Jesus, we have two citizenships; citizenship of the country and citizenship in the Kingdom of God. As we carry two citizenships, we should be responsible to both citizenships. Yes, both citizenships are important, but which one is most important for us is the question to be answered by each one of us through our lives. Pope Pius XII says "*Only a true Catholic can become a true citizen of the country.*"

Dear friends, as we live in this modern world, there is no doubt that we have faced and will face conflict in our mind, to make a choice between the law of the country and the law of the Kingdom of God. When you are in a situation like this, what will be the choice you will make in your life? Jesus answered His enemies a conflicting question by looking at the image of the coin they presented to Him. The same way, as a disciple of Jesus Christ, in those conflicting situations I would like to remind you that, the priority should be given to the law of the Kingdom of God. Because, we have the image of God in ourselves not the image of the state. Yes, the word of God says "*we are created in the image and likeness of God.*" Even though, we have dual citizenship, our real citizenship is in Heaven. So, as we live in this world, we should be careful that, we don't compromise on the citizenship of Heaven, if we do so, we reduce our own value, God has given to us. Yes, we belong to God primarily, not to the world.

Reflecting sincerely, there is no doubt that every one of us have made a compromise and reduced our value by going after the world over God. Yes, we have failed to give enough time, treasure and talent to God and, thus put down God and His values in this world. Through our sins we had lost our value, but through Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection He gave us back lost value. Today, as we commemorate the same Passion, death and resurrection of Jesus through this Holy Eucharist, let us ask the Lord's forgiveness for our repeated negligence and thus get back our real value.

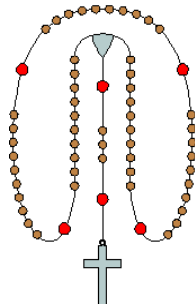

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacraments to the Home-Bound

Please inform the pastor or the parish office if you know of anyone who is home-bound, so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.
