Dear Loving Friends in Jesus Christ,

If you remember, last weekend, the Gospel was discussing about the importance of paying tax, the question raised by Jewish leaders to trap Jesus; *"Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?"*. After having faced the question successfully and silenced Jewish leaders, through a well reflected answer from Jesus; *"repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God"*, today Pharisees are making another attempt to trap Jesus with another question; *"Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?"* As you know, in Jesus' time, scribes and Pharisees were the official interpreters of the Mosaic law, and they were proud of their knowledge of the law too. Today, by asking this question about the law, they are testing the knowledge of Jesus about the Jewish law.

As an answer to their question, Jesus replied *"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. And you shall love your neighbor as yourself."* Combining two laws as one; *"love of God and love of neighbor"*, Jesus again surprised and silenced the Pharisees. Because, they always thought and taught that Love of God, is all about obeying the Mosaic Law strictly, which will enable one to get into Heaven. And so, they did not show any concern to people and their needs, and their main concern was to making people to obey the law strictly. But today, through the answer of Jesus, Jesus makes it very clear that, love of God has its fulfillment only in the love of the neighbor.

Yes, dear friends, Jesus not only preached about the greatest law, rather He lived this greatest law, through His passion, death and resurrection. The birth, death and resurrection of Jesus is the perfect example of the greatest law; Love of God and love of neighbor. There is no doubt that, the entire life of Jesus is the example of Love of God and Love of neighbor as well, because Jesus was able to relate with His Father in Heaven and at the same time, He was able to translate that Love to each one of us through His public ministry of preaching, curing the sick, casting out demons etc. This is the same type of relationship all of us are requested to maintain in our lives too, and only then the Heaven on earth will be possible.

As we reflect, there is no doubt that we all fail in one way or other at times to maintain a same degree of love for God and neighbor. We all face a loose connection in our relationship to God and neighbor. So it is our responsibility to find out the reasons for our loose connection to God and neighbor. Just like, only when a light bulb is well connected with the socket, the light bulb will work. The same way, in the place of the light bulb, we all need to get connected well with the socket of Jesus, only then through our lives we can love our neighbor through the brightness of our good lives. During this mass let us pray that the good Lord will flood our minds, hearts and souls with the love of God and neighbor.

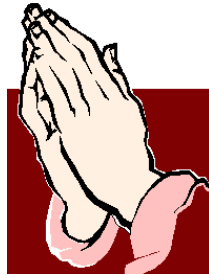

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacraments to the Home-Bound

Please inform the pastor or the parish office if you know of anyone who is home-bound, so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.
