



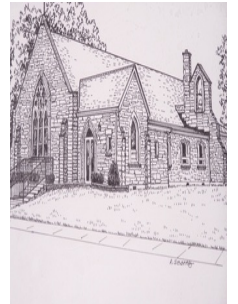

My Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Since from the Ascension of the Lord on last weekend, everyone of us, along with the disciples of Jesus, are called to experience Jesus in a different way through the Spirit, and all the more Jesus has promised us that "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age". Today we are witnessing the fulfillment of Jesus' great promise to each one of us, through the descending of the Spirit, and so we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. By celebrating this great feast of the Holy Spirit in our faith, everyone is called to begin a new ministry in the name of Jesus, the ministry of forgiveness or the ministry of love. We read from the Gospel, Jesus says "Peace be with you. As the father has sent me, so I send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Yes, through this new experience of the Spirit, the disciples are no longer disciples in life but they are turning out to be Apostles. A great change for the glory of God, and every one of us are called to make this change, a transformation from a disciple to Apostle, to be an apostle of forgiveness and love. Yes, everyone is called to have a new birth in the spirit of love.

It happened in Rome. Three sisters of Mother Theresa Convent went to a house of an old man in the city. The whole house was really a mess. The sisters cleaned the house and before leaving they prepared some food and hot water for the old man and left the house. The sisters did not speak anything to the old man, neither the old man to the sisters. The sisters continued this service in silence twice a day. After a week the old man broke the silence and told the sisters "you brought God to my home and now will you get a priest to my home to hear my confession?" It was after a long 60 years the old man was making his confession. On the following day the old man died.

Yes my dear friends, every one of us have received the power of the Holy Spirit, to forgive and to love, but why is that great power not used effectively in our lives? Yes, Jesus has breathed His Spirit of love and forgiveness on each one of us, but why it is not shared among ourselves? Sometimes it is good to have some breathing problem in our lives, so that we will understand the importance of breath in our lives. Today, if we are not able to experience and share the breath of Jesus, be sure we have some serious breathing trouble in Jesus, and that is the root cause of all other problems in our lives too.

Dr. Yung says "I have treated thousands of mentally disordered people and among them I have found only a few Catholics, because they have the sacrament of penance." Dear friends, this statement of Dr. Yung, underlines the effect of penance in the lives of Catholics. Yes, my dear friends we need forgiveness and others need forgiveness from us, for it gives new life to both parties. The call is on to be an Apostle of love and forgiveness. God Bless you all.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

Sacraments to the Home Bound: Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

Sacrament of Marriage: A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.
