





Through the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus makes a comment to each one of us that, "Where your treasure is, there your heart be also". There spread a rumor in Rome that a woman called Cornelia has invaluable and beautiful pearls in her custody. A merchant who has a good collection of different types of pearls wanted to have those pearls from Cornelia. So he went to her house. Cornelia smiled at him and took him to the next room and showed him two beautiful kids playing there and told him these are my invaluable pearls, and she continued I will have to leave these two precious pearls in order to have the treasure of the Kingdom of God, for Kingdom of God is more precious than these two pearls.

Yes, the Kingdom of God is the treasure that Jesus is promising us today. We have gathered here to enjoy this treasure of the Kingdom of God. In order to have this treasure, we celebrate all the sacraments in our Catholic Church. In order to experience this treasure of the Kingdom of God, we all pray together joining our hands and hearts, "Thy kingdom come, they will be done and on earth as it is in heaven". Yes, it has been many years since we have celebrated the sacraments, praying together and searching for this treasure of the Kingdom of God through the Holy Catholic Church, so why are many of us are not able to find and experience it in our lives? Sacrament of Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated upon request, and at least four times a year at all the weekend Masses. Please notify the pastor or call the parish office if you know of anyone who might need this sacrament, but may not be able to notify the pastor personally. Please inform the pastor if you or any one in your family is in the hospital. If you notify us before surgery, we can celebrate this sacrament before you are admitted to the hospital. If your doctor is willing, we can also have a blessing for him/her at the time of your anointing.

Sacraments to the Home Bound: Please inform the pastor if you know of anyone who is homebound so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.

Sacrament of Marriage: A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the priest. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter Weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.
