Welcome to St. Augustine / St. Peter of Alcantara Parish!

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

The very purpose of our life is to live, to live is to love, and to love is to sacrifice. Yes, we are all living in this world, but do we live our life meaningfully with love-love of God and neighbor? Yes, a true love demands sacrifice, followed by change in our lives, in others and in the world. As we are in the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, all the readings given to us stress the point of Love in our lives and in other's lives. The readings remind us that, love is not only an emotional feeling of oneself for others, but more than that it is our primary responsibility towards others as a Christian/Catholic.

Yes, the signature of a true Christian or Christianity is nothing but love. Today, by stressing the point of love, Jesus invites all of us to be a responsible and true Christian. The first reading from the book of Ezekiel says that, *"if you don't speak out to change the wicked from his way, the wicked shall die for his guilt, but I will hold you responsible for his death. But if you warn the wicked to change his way of life, and he refuses to turn from his way, he shall die for his guilt, but you shall save yourself."* Yes, as a Christian, my responsibility is not only to my own salvation, rather, it is extended to the salvation of my brother or sister too. In the second reading from the book of Romans, St. Paul tells us that, everything has its fulfillment only in Love.

When we come to the Gospel, Jesus proposes, a four-step procedure to fulfill our responsibility for the other, to get back our estranged brother or sister to the community of love. The whole interest of the passage is that we should all work towards reconciliation rather than punishment. The first step calls for a fraternal correction; the two people concerned to solve the issue among themselves privately, so that that will not humiliate the offending person. The first approach is a painful duty, which demands qualities like; courage, compassion, patience, gentleness, humility, sincerity, respect, true listening, understanding etc. If the first step does not work, the second step is to bring one or two others along with you, not for the purpose of proving the other is wrong, but to help in the process of reconciliation. If the second step also does not work out; we are encouraged to try the third step to report to the local community of faith, Church, so that the personal relationship can be rectified in an atmosphere of Christian prayer, Christian love and Christian fellowship.

If all the above steps fail to produce any result, then the fourth and final step is taken as the last resort. Jesus says, the offender should be treated as a Gentile or Roman tax collector. It does not mean that the non-repentant person should be ignored forever. Surprisingly, for Jesus that means continuing friendship. Because, the Gospel calls Jesus a friend of sinners and tax collectors, and Jesus reconciled many sinners with the Heavenly Father: Mary Magdalene, Matthew, Zacchaeus, the woman caught in adultery and many others. Yes, dear friends, Jesus does not abandon anyone. He loves us all. At the same time, we should also love all, only then we

create Heaven on earth.

Once a man approached St. Francis of Assisi and said to him, *"Brother Francis, I am in a dilemma. In the Bible it says we should rebuke sinners, but I see people sinning all the time. I don't feel like I should go around rebuking everybody."* St. Francis thought for a moment and then said, *"What you must do is 'live in such a way that your life rebukes the sinner.'* How you act will call others to repentance. Yes, dear friends, let us live a life of love of God and neighbor. So the world will be more beautiful than what we see now. **God Bless!**

Disciples Response Fund

During the past week, all the registered members of our parish received a letter from Bishop Medley asking for financial support of the Disciples Response Fund.

One of the ways that most parishes in the United States assist in the work of their dioceses is by participation in an Annual Appeal such as the Disciples Response Fund.

All parishes in the Diocese of Owensboro have been assigned a voluntary target for the DRF based on their income relative to all other parishes. Once a parish exceeds that target in DRF payments, 50% of the balance will be returned to us for our use. There will be no assessment to pay on this rebate.

St. Augustine parish has received a rebate of \$464.82 from last year's DRF as of September 5th.

St. Peter parish has received a rebate of \$161.44 from last year's DRF as of September 5th.

The 2017- 2018 parish target for

St. Augustine is \$2,049.54

St. Peter is \$3,964.07.

The good works that are funded by the Disciples Response Fund deserve our support. These are things that cannot be done by a parish on its own. For example, the formation of seminarians and the funding of a charitable trust fund where the earnings supports health benefits for retired priests. In addition, a percentage of the funds are set aside to fund an endowment that already reduces parish assessments by about 5%.

As you read Bishop Medley's letter and the enclosed materials, please reflect upon the theme of this year's campaign. This theme is taken from the Gospel of John. "I have chosen you....". John15:16. Each of us has been called to share the Gospel message with others. Please help the Word of God touch all of those who benefit from the Disciples Response Fund by giving generously.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacraments to the Home-Bound

Please inform the pastor or the parish office if you know of anyone who is home-bound, so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.
