### **Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,**

Last weekend we celebrated the Ascension of our Lord Jesus into heaven, where Jesus took off from the disciples to be with His heavenly father; just as He promised before leaving, Jesus sends the helper to His disciples to continue His mission in this world. So today we have the celebration of Pentecost, the descending of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles.

As we celebrate the Pentecost, one might ask, why do we need the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives? The simplest answer is to become a witness to Christ like the disciples and other saints in our Church. Do we have the Holy Spirit within us? Yes, we do have, we believed to have the dwelling of the Holy Spirit within us since from time we have received the sacrament of Baptism. If we have the presence of the Holy Spirit, why do we fail often to become a witness to Christ through our daily lives? It is because we don't respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. We know well that, if we do not practice our special abilities, we cannot be the best in our performance. The same way only when we respond to the gifts of the Holy Spirit from time to time we can become a true witness to Christ. This is what we learn from the Gospel of Matthew 13:12 *“whoever has will be given more; whoever does not have, even what they have will be taken away from them.”*

If anyone wants to know the result of the works of the Holy Spirit this could be learned from the lives of disciples. They were not well qualified people with degrees, they were just ordinary people and most of them were fishermen. But when they opened up their hearts to receive the Holy Spirit, they all became a new creation in Jesus Christ. And so, their fear turned out to be peace and joy and they accepted the commissioning of Jesus to preach the Good news without any kind of questioning.

Right after the baptismal ceremony, the priest puts a white garment on the candidates and says *“you have become a new creation, and have clothed yourself in Christ. See in this white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity. With your family and friends they help you by word and example, and bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven.”* After listening to this, how many of us can sincerely say that we have fulfilled or are fulfilling our responsibility as Christian parents or as God parents? Think sincerely, all of us can find that we have failed many times in our responsibilities as parents and God parents.

Yes, change should happen according to the spirit of God, and so it is important that change should begin from one's own self and then to others. So, as we continue to

celebrate this Mass, let us ask the Eucharistic Lord to help us to renew the spirit within us and thus become a true witness to Christ. **May God Bless You.**

### **Sacrament of Marriage**

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

### **Sacrament of Baptism**

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

### **Sacraments to the Home-Bound**

Please inform the pastor or the parish office if you know of anyone who is home-bound, so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.
