Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

The scripture often reminds us that God loves us and so He sent His only son, Jesus, to us. Jesus being the obedient son of His father fulfilled His saving mission through His passion and death. The Gospel of today is the final discourse of Jesus to His disciples before His preparation to His passion and death, a departure filled with terrible anxiety. Here, Jesus is not anxious about His passion and death, but He is so much anxious about His loving disciples. The last discourse of Jesus to His disciples clearly brings out His unconditional love for His disciples. The scene we have in the Gospel of today is taking place during the Last supper; here, Jesus is reminding His disciples that He is not leaving them alone; although He is not going to be with them physically they will be supported by the Holy Spirit. Yes, they will be able to get the support of the Holy Spirit, provided they live the word that Jesus had told them in their lives.

Yes, dear friends, the Holy Spirit is the helper/advocate promised by Jesus to each one of us in the physical absence of Jesus in this world. The Holy Spirit is very much active and alive in our midst, but do we allow the Holy Spirit to work in our lives? Looking around and witnessing various unfortunate things happening and looking deeply into our own sinful hearts, we can say without any hesitation that we do not really give enough room for the Holy spirit to work in our lives. When the Holy Spirit is not given enough room in our lives, there comes the evil spirit in our lives and in the world; that is what we see around the world mostly, and thereby people with troubled hearts.

Jesus says to each one of us clearly "*Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid*". Taking this advice of Jesus, one would say, how can it be possible, as long as we live in this troubled world? Dear friends, just like any one of us in the world, let us not forget that Jesus also lived in this troubled world. Jesus also faced the same realities of hardships and problems, just like any one of us are going through. But His heart was not troubled. He was not afraid of anyone, because Jesus always had placed His trust in His Father's word; thus, Jesus was able to fulfill His Father's will too.

As Christians, though in words we say we are in Jesus, in reality we are not in Jesus completely. Very often we depend on worldly things and depend mostly on one's own abilities, so we are troubled and feared; we fail to experience a lasting peace in our lives. Jesus says very clearly that the world sponsored peace is combined with trouble and fear, but the peace He promises is an everlasting peace. So to experience the promised peace of Jesus in

our lives and in the world, there is no other way than surrendering ourselves into the hands of the Lord. This is how Jesus found peace even in His last moments of His life. The scripture says, Jesus breathed His last by saying "*into Thy hands I commend my spirit*". Let us pray that the Peace of Christ rules this world. **God Bless You.**

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacraments to the Home-Bound

Please inform the pastor or the parish office if you know of anyone who is home-bound, so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.
