Dear Brothers & Sisters in Jesus Christ,

Today, the Holy Mother Church celebrates the Solemnity of Holy Trinity. A celebration of love and unity within the celebration of the expression of love; so, today, Jesus asks us to be united in love.

Once, St. Augustine was walking on the seashore, thinking about the mystery of the Trinity. There he observed a child carrying water in a small pot and pouring it in a nearby pool. "What are you doing?" asked the saint to the child. "I want to pour out the whole water of the sea into my pool", announced the child. Laughing at the child, the saint exclaimed: "you will never succeed in that". Then, the child stood up and said: "I do exactly as you do: Do you think that with your small understanding, you will be able to discover the mystery of Trinity?"

Yes, how can we speak of One God with three persons? No one can understand this reality. Many have tried to understand the reality called God, Trinity etc., but they reach nowhere. So, in reality the Trinity is Faith Oriented, than Brain Oriented. We have great and greatest scientists in the world who are able to give definition for any reality under the sky, but they never succeeded in defining to God, Trinity etc. and that is the uniqueness of our God.

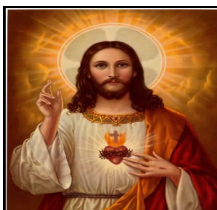
When we reflect about the Holy Trinity, first and foremost, we have to understand the fact that they are three persons in one reality called God and their basis is same. The basis for their unity is nothing other the LOVE. Though they are different persons, they cannot be separated, they remain always united. So, the Holy trinity is the perfect symbol of UNITY in the world. Though they remain in Unity, they have their own functions to do; Father-creates, Son-Protects and the Holy Spirit sanctify's us.

As Christians, we need to be united with this Trinitarian God and only then can we be saved. To experience this Trinity in our daily life is the most important task given to us by the gospel. Although often we call upon this Trinitarian God, we don't actually realize this. As Jesus became the mediator between God and Man in the world, in this Trinitarian aspect too, Jesus remains the mediator or the central figure, and we cannot make any changes to it. The importance of JESUS' centrality could be seen in many places in the Bible. In the Name of the Father, and of the SON, and of the Holy Spirit. When we are asked about Holy Family, we remember about a picture where Jesus is centered between Mother Mary and Joseph Jesus is at the center of the Alter, for the Last supper Jesus is crucified between two thieves Jesus says "where two or three are gathered in my name, will be there in the midst of them (Mt:18:20) After eight days His disciples were again inside, and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, the doors having been shut, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." (Jn.20:26). In the wedding at Cana, Mary says, "Do whatever He tells you". Thus Jesus becomes the central point here, to solve the problem.

Jesus often took the central seat to teach the people and His disciples.....

Between Earth and Sky he was crucified. We often reserve central and good seat for the important guest. So, knowingly or unknowingly we know that Jesus is an important person in our lives and that is why we say I reserve my Heart for Jesus, and on human body Heart seem to be at the center. Jesus was crucified on three nails and that could be attributed to Holy Trinity.

So in all situations, Jesus needs to be given an important and central place. As Jesus took the mediator between God and Man, in our lives too, for a peaceful life we need the mediatorship of Jesus in our lives. We can create problems, but we need the grace of God to solve the problem. So as we reflect about the Mystery of Holy Trinity, first and foremost, we need to experience Jesus in our lives, and by experiencing Jesus, we can have the experience of God and Holy Spirit too. Thus we can experience the Holy Trinity and be united in Peace, Love and Unity.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacraments to the Home-Bound

Please inform the pastor or the parish office if you know of anyone who is home-bound, so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.
