Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 9:51-62

We live in an age of confusion. Confusion concerning the human person, common sense, dignity, and respect. We live in an age that is radically different than when many of us grew up. Many of us remember days of communal work, riding a bicycle without a helmet, growing up working in the field. Yet, as we continue to live we witness things that we never expected. Computers on our wrists, cars that drive themselves, and people applauded for being rude. For many, these things grate against our sensibilities, and make us ask the question of what has happened. One thing that has changed is our understanding of society as a whole. From the middle ages, to the beginning of the modern era there existed a term known as Christendom. Roughly speaking Christendom referred to a society largely founded and united upon Christian principles. With the development of the modern era, the definite end of Christendom was realized. The reality is that we hold on to vestiges of what society should be, and what the Church should be. Some would consider this as a difficult age for the Church; however, the reality is that it is the time when the Church thrives. If we engage the history of the Church, we can recognize distinct ages that took place in the life of the Church. The first age was an apostolic age, one where the living memory of the Apostles reigned. A time filled with doubt, uncertainty, and confusion. The first age began in a crisis, developed into an age of peaceful belief, and then entered into crisis again. Our current age resembles that early Apostolic Age of the Church. An era defined by confusion, uncertainty, and doubt. There are various crises in the Church and world, it is an age that demands reflection and understanding. Then as a Church it requires reflection to discern the best movement forward. The research suggests, and practical experience reveals that the vast majority of those in the Catholic Church possess a limited understanding of the faith. So as a Church then we must address those needs. How do we work for evangelization, if at first we do not understand what the word evangelization means? It is a new era in the Church, one in which we are invited to grow in our love for God, and one which we all have to ask ourselves why we believe what we believe. To do so then we must first return to the most basic premise, knowing that God is real. This week, it may be helpful to ask yourself, how do you know that God is real in your life.

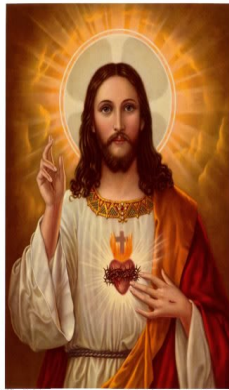

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacraments to the Home-Bound

Please inform the pastor or the parish office if you know of anyone who is home-bound, so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.
