My dear Loving Friends in Jesus Christ,

Today, the Holy Mother Church celebrates the solemnity of the Precious Body & Blood of Christ/ *Corpus Christi*. So let us earnestly pray to the Eucharistic Lord to give us his protection through His most Precious Body and Blood.

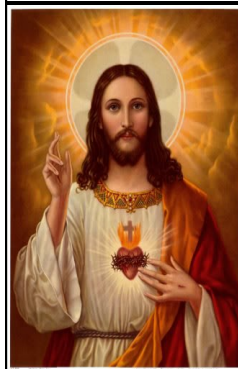
Catholics are the most beautiful and most blessed people in the world, because we have received three gifts from Heaven and it is given only to Catholics. The first gift is the Heavenly Father, the second gift is the Heavenly Prayer the Lord's Prayer and the third gift is the Bread from Heaven and that is the Holy Eucharist. Today, we thank the Lord for the gift of the Holy Eucharist through the celebration of the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. Through His offering of Body and Blood, for the salvation of the whole world, Jesus establishes the supreme covenant in the world; **the covenant of Love**. And this covenant of Love supersedes all other covenant, rules & sacrifices in this world.

The celebration of the Most Precious Body and Blood of Jesus is an expression of Jesus' selfless love for you and me; and this love is the specialty of Gods basic nature. To this love every Christian is called to experience and express it with others. Every sacrament in the Holy Catholic Church is the source of Jesus' Love for each one of us, and especially the sacrament of sacraments; the **Holy Eucharist**.

Today, we find a striking similarity between the Old and New covenant. Moses spoke on Mount Sinai: "This is the blood of the covenant that Yahweh has made for you." (Ex 24:8). This Old covenant assured the liberation of the people of Israel from the bondage of Egypt. When Jesus called the new covenant; "This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, poured out for many..." it assures the liberation of the world from sin and death. We are as Christians we are the members of the new covenant, but how much trust and faith we have for this covenant of Eucharist? It is also time to evaluate our own Eucharistic Life. Do I make any effort to show Jesus that I love Him more than anything in this world? With baptism we become the partakers of Jesus' Body and Blood, but how

much value we give to this Eucharist in our lives? The problem with Christians is that, though he has the weapon against all kinds of evil in this world, he never realizes the power of the weapon he is gifted with: **The Holy Eucharist**. *If you take your master Jesus seriously, He will take you seriously.* It says that, there is an uninterrupted celebration of Holy Eucharist going on around the world and that is the reason the world still exists. I think, we need to believe and accept this saying, because our God is faithful to His promises, that in Mathew 28: 20 Jesus says, "...And behold I am with you always, until the end of the age." And Jesus is with us always through the Holy Eucharist. So as we celebrate the solemnity of the Most precious Body and Blood of Jesus, let us ask the Eucharistic Lord to increase our faith in Eucharist and love for Eucharist. Thus our life will become a Eucharist in this world, to lead the world to peace, joy, harmony and genuine Love.

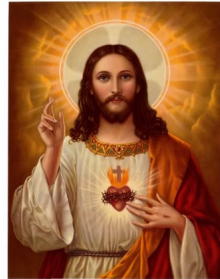

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacraments to the Home-Bound

Please inform the pastor or the parish office if you know of anyone who is home-bound, so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.
