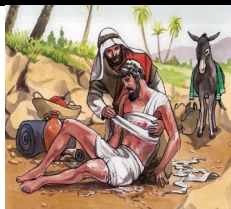

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 10:25-37

How we envision God often determines how we approach God. If we see God as an angry father, who is distant from his children, then, we naturally possess some aversion to speaking with God. If we envision God as a long haired surfer, with sand on his feet, and a dark tan, then there is a tendency to think that anything goes. If we envision God as a loving and caring father, then we are open to developing a relationship with God. Our vision of God impacts our relating to God. Sacred Scripture allows us the opportunity to witness the characteristics and traits of God. One characteristic of God that is predominant in both the Old and New Testament is the loving father. There are three distinct traits that Sacred Scripture offers concerning God as the loving Father. The first trait is that God as Father protects His children. Genesis 4:15, "Then the Lord put a mark on Cain so that no one who found him would kill him." God punished Cain for killing Able; however, God's love was still present and protected Cain as He was banished from the land. The second trait is that a good father provides for his family. Exodus 16:4, "Then the Lord said to Moses, 'I will rain down bread from heaven for you. The people are to go out each day and gather enough for that day.'" While wandering in the desert God provided food, and shelter for His people. The third trait is that the good father establishes his family. Luke 9:1-2, "When Jesus had called the Twelve together, he gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases, and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick." Jesus established the apostles, He gave them what they needed for their mission. The loving father then protects, provides, and establishes his people. If our vision of God is a loving father that protects, provides, and establishes us; then, it is easier to understand the many times that Jesus reminds us to not be afraid. To not be afraid of God, to not be afraid of what is happening in our families, to not be afraid of what comes next, and to focus upon the blessings that God wishes to pour out upon us. This week, it might be a good time to remind ourselves that we worship a God who protects us, provides for us, and establishes us as His beloved sons and daughters.

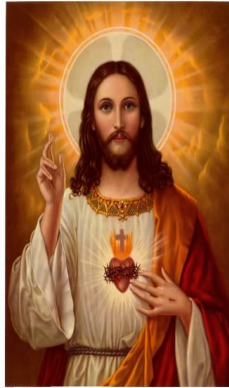
