Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

"Repent and believe in the Gospel, for the Kingdom of God is at hand." This is the message St. John the Baptist, Jesus, the disciples and today every Christian is called to preach and to establish. In the process of establishing the Kingdom of God in our midst, miracles, healings, casting our demons, and many other signs are considered to be part of it, remember, not the whole of it. In today's world and in Jesus' time too, so many people misunderstood those miracles, healings, casting out of demons and many other signs, and so people followed Jesus and His disciples wherever they went. So in today's Gospel, Jesus is reproaching the misunderstanding of the people by saying *"Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the bread and were filled."*

Reflecting on the comment Jesus made about people's misunderstanding, let us ask a couple of questions to ourselves - how eager are we to look for Jesus in our lives? Why are we looking for Jesus in our lives? We look for Jesus, because we need some special blessings from Him like-healing, good jobs, good family, financial blessing, solving problems etc.? Please let us not be opportunists in our relationship with God, and reduce the quality of our own Christian life. Jesus says *"first seek the Kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you."* (Mt.6:33). Yes, dear friends, when Jesus is ready to give us the true bread, why should we seek for the scrap? Jesus reminds us *"Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you."* There is no problem in working for the food that perishes like; food, money, jobs, healing etc., but the problem lies in the priority we give in our lives. Often, we give priority to creations than the creator, and so we fall into sin and miss the gift of eternal life.

Today, Jesus promises us eternal life by inviting us to give priority to the Creator Jesus Himself, by accomplishing the works of God. Jesus says to us that accomplishing the works of God is to believe in Him. To believe in Jesus Christ is to believe in Jesus' saying that *"I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."* Yes, this is an invitation to believe in the Holy Eucharist, and the challenge here for us is to believe that Jesus is fully present in the Holy Eucharist.

Dear friends, to do all kinds of signs like miracles, healings, casting out demons etc., Jesus did not have to bear

any kind of pain on Himself, but to quench our hunger and thirst, to become a Holy Eucharist, and to be present in the Holy Eucharist, Jesus bore extreme pain on Himself by sacrificing Himself completely for us. So, let us not look for the little blessings from the Lord that perishes, but let us look for the greatest blessing of the experience of the Eucharistic Lord in our lives through this Holy Eucharist, which assures us eternal life. Jesus says to us *"I am with you always, to the very end of the age."* (Mt.28:20). The Holy Eucharist is the fulfillment of this promise; so, let us be more serious about this sacrament of the Holy Eucharist and experience Him. **May God Bless You.**

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend or the Sponsor Couple Program.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend an evening class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor and set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacraments to the Home-Bound

Please inform the pastor or the parish office if you know of anyone who is home-bound, so that we can insure that they are afforded ample opportunities to receive the Sacraments. We would rather be notified by several people than to not be notified at all, so please don't presume that someone else has already notified us.
